Serves 12

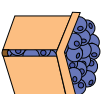
2 C apple juice



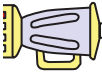
4 C strawberries



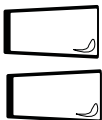
4 C blueberries

12 paper cups



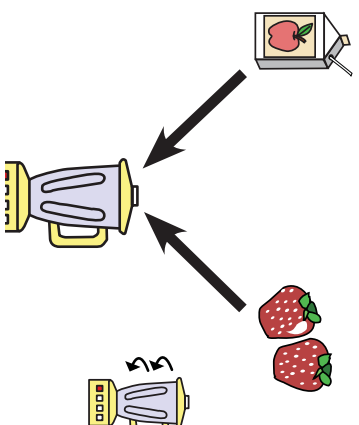
12 popsicle sticks

2. Pour into cups filling half way.



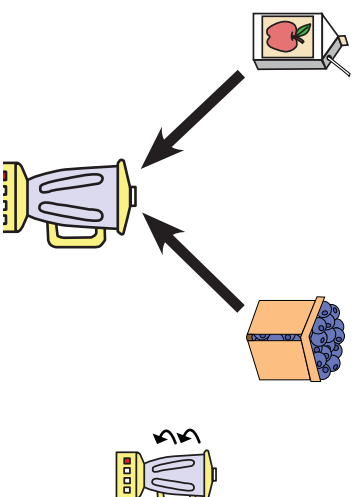
3. Cover cups with foil and insert popsicle sticks.

5. Put 1 C apple juice and blueberries in blender. Blend until smooth.



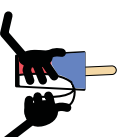
6. Remove foil and pour in cups.



7. Freeze for 2 hours, or until solid.

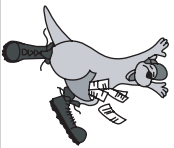
