

IPADD EXPECTATIONS

Our expectation is that every person with a developmental disability, supported appropriately, can live a safe, meaningful, and connected life in their home community. To achieve this goal, Illinois must:

- 1. Commit immediately to raising the state fiscal investment in Home and Community-Based Services (HCBS) from our current rank of 46th in the nation (per capita) to at least a mid-range ranking.
- 2. Shorten, and eventually eliminate, the PUNS (Prioritization for Urgency of Need for Services) waiting list, which currently holds the names of 18,974 Illinois citizens with developmental disabilities who want to receive HCBS for their care.
- 3. Make equitable rate adjustments for community services across regions, settings, and HCBS waivers so that all individuals (including those with medical, behavioral, or mental health challenges) can afford quality care and services in their homes or communities.

To this end, IPADD will continue to draft, promote, and monitor public policy in the State of Illinois and hold its legislators accountable.



LETTER FROM THE EDITORS

Dear Illinois Citizens:

Just as it did throughout the country and the world, COVID-19 brought with it changes and flexibilities to the Illinois General Assembly. The 2020 Spring Session of the 101st General Assembly sputtered to a halt well before bills affecting people with developmental disabilities could be passed. Legislators returned to Springfield at the end of May, when a 1st Special Session was efficiently organized to address emergent issues directly connected to the pandemic.

We have scored four of the bills which passed during the special session — two budget bills (SB264 & HB357), the elections omnibus bill (SB1863), and the healthcare omnibus bill (SB1864). We recognize that it's hardly fair to assign scores based on a small sampling of bills; instead, we decided to write a cumulative scorecard covering bills from 2016-2020. We reached back to the four prior scorecards and included data from votes on 40 previous bills, for a grand total of 44 bills.

We are looking forward to a time when crisis doesn't drive decision-making and when a return to our prior legislative priorities might be possible. We also recognize the power of a crisis to quickly shift old ways of doing things and to pave the way for change and innovation.

This year we've taken especial note of Rep. LaToya Greenwood, Rep. Theresa Mah, and Rep. Nicholas Smith, who each maintained a 100% score over the course of two or more years of voting. This represents an understanding of the issues and, importantly, the discipline to show up and vote.

EXPLANATION OF SCORING

This cumulative scorecard covers 44 bills in all, ten each from the 2016-2019 legislative sessions and four bills from the 1st Special Session in 2020. All 44 bills passed both chambers, but not all were signed into law. Bills were selected for their relevance to home and community living for Illinois citizens with developmental disabilities.

IPADD has only opposed one of the 44 bills, the 2016 Continuum of Care Services bill (SB2610). The 43 bills we supported have covered a wide range of topics, including broader budget bills and bills relating to elections, ABLE accounts, sex education, SNAP benefits, healthcare, Medicaid, the PUNS database, employment, personal needs allowance, and wage bills for a more stable provider workforce.

We continue to believe in the power of legislative leaders to guide the rest of the legislature and have once again reported the scores of top leaders in the House and Senate, as well as a score for the governor.

Voting on each bill has been weighted equally. No points were given for legislators who were absent or non-voting, regardless of the reason. While we recognize that COVID-19 may have led to increased absences, we are not always privy to a legislator's health status or reason for missing a vote; therefore, scores were not adjusted for pandemic-related causes. Newer legislators have not been penalized in any way for votes that they missed before gaining office. We have transferred vote records for representatives who were later appointed or elected to the Illinois Senate.

This report does not include raw data, but legislative votes are a matter of public record and can be viewed on the Illinois General Assembly (ILGA) website.

Congratulations to three standout legislators, who each maintained a 100% score over the course of two or more years of voting — Rep. **LaToya Greenwood**, Rep. **Theresa Mah**, and Rep. **Nicholas Smith**. We are grateful for your consistency.



OUR PHILOSOPHY


